Rockingham Sharks v South Perth Lions - Kick Off 3.30pm

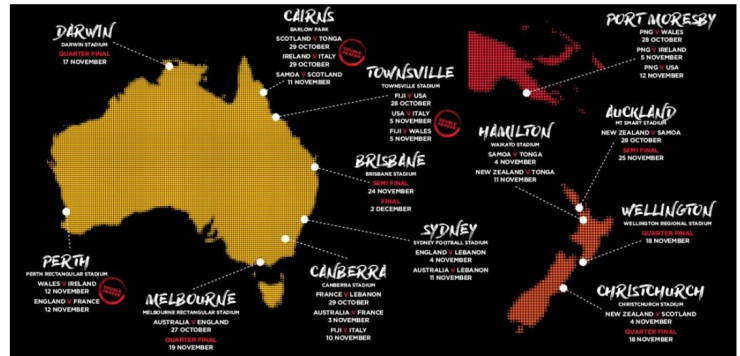
